## Global disease burden and funding – explaining the disparities

In 2011, \$7.7 billion was allocated to HIV/AIDS projects, while malaria, TB, and maternal, newborn and child health received \$1.8 billion, \$1.3 billion, and \$6.1 billion respectively. NCDs received only 1.5% of all health aid. Sam Byfield explores the reasons for these disparities in funding.
