Civil Society Status Reports (CSSR) are a form of civil society monitoring, with the aim of understanding national/regional responses to NCDs and assessing them from a civil society perspective. In 2014-2015, each partner developed a CSSR on NCDs, drawing upon the NCD Alliance benchmarking tool. Through the CSSR process, partners identify advocacy priorities.
