

Summary Table Outcome Document of the UN High-Level Review on NCDs July 2014

NCDs and	- Reaffirm NCDs as a major challenge for health and development in the 21 st century;
Sustainable Development	- Consider addressing NCDs in the post-2015 development agenda;
Leadership & Governance	 By 2015, set national NCD targets for 2025 and process indicators taking into account the 9 global NCD targets;
	 By 2015, develop or strengthen national multisectoral policies and plans to achieve national targets by 2025 taking into account the Global NCD Action Plan
	 Develop, strengthen and implement multisectoral public policies and action plans for health education and health literacy;
	 Develop and implement national policies and plans, with financial and human resources allocated, in which social determinants of health are included;
	 Raise awareness of NCDs, and the links between NCDs, poverty, and social and economic development;
	 Consider establishing multisectoral mechanisms, e.g. high level commission, agency, or task force for NCDs;
	 Integrate measures to address NCDs into health planning and national development planning and policies, including UN Development Assistance Frameworks;
	 Enhance capacity, mechanisms and mandates of relevant authorities to ensure action across governmental sectors;
	 Strengthen capacity of ministers of health to exercise strategic leadership and coordination role in policy development that engages all stakeholders including governments, NGOs, civil society and the private sector;
	 Implement health-in-all-policies and whole-of-government, multisectoral approaches to health within governments, while protecting from conflict of interest;
	 Develop effective legislation, cross-sectoral structures, processes, methods and resources that address health determinants, health protection, health equity, and health system functioning, and measure and track economic, social and environmental determinants and disparities in health;
	 Develop institutional capacity for assessing the impact on health of policy initiatives in all sectors;
Prevention & risk factor	- By 2016 , reduce risk factors for NCDs and the underlying social determinants , building on guidance in appendix 3 of Global NCD Action Plan 2013-2020;
exposure	 Mobilize political will and resources to support implementation of Global Action Plan; Global Strategy on Diet, Physical Activity and Health; Global Strategy to Reduce Harmful Use of Alcohol; WHO and UNICEF Global Strategy for Infant and Young Child Feeding; and WHO Set of Recommendations on Marketing of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages to Children;
	 Accelerate implementation of the Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC); Encourage policies that support production, manufacture and access to foods contributing to a healthy diet, including utilisation of healthy local agricultural products;

Health By 2016, strengthen and orient health systems with regard to people-centred primary systems health care and universal health coverage throughout the life cycle, building on guidance in appendix 3 of the Global NCD Action Plan 2013-2020; - Consider synergies between NCDs and other conditions, including mental and neurological conditions, in order to develop a comprehensive response for NCDs; - Consider possible linkages between NCDs and some communicable diseases, such as HIV/AIDS, and call for integration of HIV/AIDS and NCD responses; - Promote the inclusion of NCDs within sexual and reproductive health, maternal and child health, and communicable disease programmes especially at the primary healthcare level; Increase access to cost-effective cancer screening, and vaccinations to prevent infections associated with cancer, as part of national programmes and schedules; **Monitoring &** - Assess progress towards attaining the 9 voluntary global targets using the agreed evaluation indicators in the global monitoring framework; - Report data on trends in NCDs and the implementation of national plans effectiveness of national policies and strategies to WHO; - Develop or strengthen monitoring systems to track social disparities in NCDs and their risk factors, with data disaggregated by sex, age and disability to address differences in morbidity and mortality between women and men; By 2015, call upon WHO in consultation with Member States to develop an approach to register and publish contributions of the private sector, philanthropic entities and civil **society** to the achievement of the nine voluntary targets; International - Align international cooperation on NCDs with national plans in order to strengthen aid cooperation effectiveness; - Strengthen international cooperation in support of national, regional and global plans, in the areas of health promotion, legislation, regulation, strengthening of health systems, training healthcare personnel, and developing healthcare infrastructure and diagnostics and transfer of technology for production of safe and quality medicines and vaccines; - Strengthen North-South, South-South and triangular cooperation; - Explore provision of adequate, predictable and sustained resources through domestic, bilateral, regional and multilateral channels including traditional and voluntary innovative financing mechanisms; - Invite OECD to consider developing a purpose code for NCDs in order to improve tracking of official development assistance in support of NCDs; - Actively promote national and international investments and strengthen national capacity for quality research and development; Reaffirm the right to use provisions in the TRIPS agreement to promote access to medicines for all, and encourage provision of assistance to developing countries; Follow up - Request for Secretary-General to submit a report of the progress achieved in the implementation of the Outcome Document by the end of 2017, in preparation for a comprehensive review of progress in 2018.
